

# COVID-19 Pandemic – United States Shelter-in-Place / Reopening Tracker

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Shelter-in-place or stay at home orders have been prevalent throughout the United States since March 2020 as state and local governments have sought to protect their citizens from the spread of the COVID-19 virus. With the spread appearing to slow, several states are now implementing plans to revise and scale back these orders to reopen their economies. Keeping abreast of the evolving nature of these orders and plans is critical to the functioning of all businesses throughout the country.

### **President Biden's COVID-19 Executive Orders**

President Biden has signed several Executive Orders since taking office as the 46th President of the United States, which are designed to help contain the COVID-19 crisis, including:

- an Executive Order on Protecting the Federal Workforce and Requiring Mask Wearing, which requires facemasks, physical distancing and adherence to CDC guidelines while on federal lands;
- an Executive Order on Promoting COVID-19 Safety in Domestic and International Travel, which requires facemasks to be worn in airports and on public transportation, and all travelers entering the United States to test negative for COVID-19 and to comply with other applicable CDC guidelines concerning international travel, including to quarantine upon arrival; and
- a Proclamation on the Suspension of Entry as Immigrants and Non-Immigrants of Certain Additional Persons Who Pose a Risk of Transmitting Coronavirus Disease, which restricts and suspends the entry into the United States of noncitizens of the United States who were physically present within the Schengen Area, the United Kingdom (excluding overseas territories outside of Europe), the Republic of Ireland, the Federative Republic of Brazil, and the Republic of South Africa during the 14-day period preceding their entry or attempted entry into the United States.
