# Appendix 1 - Essential Economic Sectors

# A. Manufacturing and its related services

- 1. Aerospace including maintenance, repair and overhaul;
- 2. Automotive manufacturing and after-sales services;
- 3. Food, beverage and its related supply chain;
- 4. Packaging and printing;
- Household products, personal care products (FMCG soap, personal cleaning product and others) and detergent including its supply chain;
- 6. Healthcare and medical care including dietary supplement;
- 7. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and fire safety equipment:
- 8. Medical equipment components;
- 9. Electrical and electronics;
- 10. Oil and Gas;
- 11. Petrochemical dan petrochemical products;
- 12. Chemical products;
- 13. Machinery and equipment;
- 14. Ceramic (ceramic as mould for manufacturing of gloves);
- 15. Iron and steel;
- 16. Textiles (which involves manufacturing of PPE);
- 17. Furniture sector; and
- 18. Manufacturing, distillation, storage, supply and distribution of fuel and lubricants

# B. Construction<sup>1</sup>

- 19. Construction:
  - (i) Critical maintenance and repair works;
  - (ii) Major public infrastructure works; and
  - (iii) Construction work of buildings that provide complete accommodation for workers on construction sites or workers housed in Central Workers Quarters (CLQ).

### C. Services

- 20. Financial services and its supply chain:
  - (i) Financial Institutions (Banking, Insurance, Takaful and other entitites licensed, approved or registered by the Central Bank of Malaysia (Bank Negara Malaysia)); and
  - (ii) Capital market entities licensed, registered or regulated by the Securities Commission Malaysia (Suruhanjaya Sekuriti Malaysia)
- 21. Municipal and local government services:
  - (i) Pawn shop/ community credit (Licensed money lender company);
  - (ii) Solid waste management/ sewerage management;

- (iii) General cleaning; and
- (iv) Premises cleaning and sanitisation;
- 22. Telecommunications and digital infrastructure including ICT services and Global Business Services (GBS):
- 23. E-commerce and its supply chain including e-marketplace services, digital payment and one-stop e-commerce internet centre;
- 24. Hotel accommodation;
- 25. Agriculture, fisheries and livestock including veterinary services;
  - (i) Farm management/ swiftlet nest/ horses/ animal processing plant/ slaughterhouse/ livestock/ animal feed factory/ suppliers such as vaccine / livestock management/ animal shop (livestock transfer operations are to be carried out at night);
  - (ii) Disease control and regulation of livestock production, livestock inputs and products related to the livestock industry (including export and import); and
  - (iii) Health management, disease diagnostic and animal treatment.
- 26. Utilities (water and energy);
- 27. Professional services (including accountant/ lawyer/ auditor/ engineer/ architect); scientific (including R&D) and technical (including maintenance);
- 28. Security Services;
- 29. Security and Defence;
- 30. Transportation via land, sea and air; and
- 31. Port, shipyard and airport operations and services, including loading, unloading and transfer of cargo, pilotage, storage and commodity exchange.

# D. Services

- 32. Warehouse and logistics;
- 33. Services / Sale / Food and Beverage Delivery; and
- 34. Retail / Distribution / Wholesale<sup>2</sup>.

### E. Plantation and Commodities

- 35. Agriculture, fisheries and livestock and its supply chain; and
- 36. Plantation and commodities and its supply chain.

#### F. Others

37. Any other service, work, industry and business as determined by the Minister of Health upon consultation with authorities regulating the relevant service, work, industry and business.

# **Appendix 2 - Critical Construction Works**

# "Critical works" permitted to continue are clarified by KKR to include:

- critical maintenance and repair works which, if halted, may cause danger to the public, the environment, or workers, such as:
  - slope works;
  - o road repairs;
  - o road repairs and maintenance;
  - o building / office repair;
  - o home remodelling;
  - o traffic management control;
  - periodic inspections and repairs of lifts/travellators/escalators/ and other critical mechanical and electrical equipment;
  - o repair, maintenance and upgrading works at premises of critical services;
  - o traffic light repairs;
  - o bailey Bridge construction at sites of any collapsed bridge;
  - o tunnelling works;
  - o emergency works pursuant to contractual obligations;
  - o maintenance work, cleaning and drying of stagnant water, pest control at construction sites; and
  - o other works which could result in danger if left incomplete.
- main public infrastructure construction works such as:
  - highways and roads;
  - bridges and viaducts;
  - LRT and MRT tracks; and
  - infrastructure relating to electricity, telecommunications, dams, drainage and sewerage, and oil and gas.
- building construction works, limited only to projects providing accommodation facilities for employees either at the construction site or at a CLQ.
- professional / consulting services, limited only to works approved for operation.
- other services in the supply chain such as the supply of building materials, delivery of materials etc., limited only to construction sites approved for operation.

# Appendix 3 - Trade and Distribution Activities that are Permitted to Operate

- 1. Shopping complex
- 2. Super market / hyper market;
- 3. Departmental store;
- 4. Pharmacy / self-care shop;
- 5. Variety store / mini mart;
- 6. Laundry services (not including self-service laundry);
- 7. Restaurant;
- 8. Furniture store;
- 9. Gold shop;
- 10. Electrical and electronic store;
- 11. Bookstore and stationery shop;
- 12. Hardware shop;
- 13. Pet / animal food shop;
- 14. Vehicle workshop, maintenance and spare parts shop;
- 15. Car distribution and sales center; and
- 16. Petrol station.

# **Appendix 4 - Prohibited Activities**

# A. Economic Activities

- 1. Night markets and midnight bazaars.
- 2. Clothing stores, self-service laundry premises, optical stores, barber shops, saloons, Spas and reflexology centres.
- 3. Tuition classes, music classes, dancing classes, art classes, research classes, language classes etc..

#### B. Entertainment

- 4. Nightclubs or pubs.
- 5. Theme parks, indoor playgrounds, family karaoke and cinemas.
- 6. Concerts or live events.

# C. Meetings

Public and private meeting with governmental agency involving attendance of representative from agency can be done by way of video conferencing.

# D. Seminars / Workshops / Conferences / Exhibitions

8. All seminars / workshops / courses / practices / conferences / speeches / exhibitions and activities in relation to Meeting, Incentives, Conventions and Exhibitions (MICE).

# E. Gatherings

- 9. Official and non-official, public and private event and any social gatherings.
- 10. Participation in any gatherings or events by a personnel from the states under the MCO, the CMCO and the RMCO to any other areas.

### F. Sports and Recreational Activities

- 11. All sports and recreational activities except for jogging and cycling.
- 12. Championships and competitions.
- 13. All sports and recreational activities which involve a large crowd and where social distancing will be difficult to maintain.
- 14. Events and sport competitions involving foreign participants.

# G. Tourism Activities

- 15. Tourisms involving travel into and outside of MCO states
- 16. Overseas travel by Malaysian citizens or travels to Malaysia by foreign tourists (save for foreign tourists from countries prescribed by the Government).

# H. Other Prohibited Activities

- 17. Any activity that will result in many people attending at a place where social distancing will be difficult to maintain and orders followed.
- 18. Other activities as decided by the Government from time to time.
